

Vista Street Bike Boulevard



What is a bike boulevard?

A bike boulevard is a traffic calmed street where people on bikes are given priority while safely sharing the road with local traffic. It provides a convenient, direct option for people of all ages and skill levels to bike and walk, including families with young children, students, commuters and recreational cyclists. Bike boulevards also help improve the health, sustainability and livability of our city. The Vista Bike Boulevard is a safe route to school for Lowell Elementary and Rogers Middle School on the east, Fremont Elementary in the middle, and Horace Mann Elementary on the west.

Can I drive straight across Vista at Redondo with the new signal?

A new bike and pedestrian traffic signal is being installed on Vista at Redondo. The signal will allow bicyclists and pedestrians traveling on Vista to continue straight across Redondo. Cars will no longer be allowed to travel straight across Redondo; they will be required to make a right turn onto Redondo. This is necessary to discourage increased traffic on Vista. Cars traveling on Redondo will still be allowed to enter Vista from Redondo by making a left or right turn.

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HOW DO I TRAVEL AROUND THE ROUNDABOUTS?



MOTORISTS

- 1) Slow Down on approach. Yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk; they have the right-of-way.
- 2) **Entering, yield** to vehicles and cyclists already in the roundabout. Merge into traffic in a counterclockwise direction.
- 3) Continue through the

roundabout until you reach your chosen direction: right, thru or left. Never stop in the roundabout.

- 4) Exit the roundabout as shown above Yield to pedestrians in the crosswalk.

CYCLISTS

- 1) Cyclists may navigate roundabouts like motorists. Do not hug the curb. Ride in the middle of the lane to prevent vehicles from passing you. Yield to pedestrians in the crosswalks.
- 2) Cyclists may also walk their bicycles across the pedestrian crosswalk.

PEDESTRIANS

- 1) At the pedestrian crosswalk, look LEFT.
- 2) Cross to the raised or painted splitter or refuge island. Look RIGHT. Finish crossing to the opposite sidewalk.
